We planted 96 trees in 2022 for reforestation and further expanding the Arboretum. In the spring, we created our tree donor program and tree trail. The Nature Play Area phase I was completed in late 2021 and we seen significant use in 2022. It was rewarding to see so many children impacted by this one of a kind space. We were thrilled to see many field trips from near and far playing in a natural space and engaging all the senses.

Investing in the future of our community is valuable from hosting Hopkins County Schools, homeschooling and private school students, and surrounding county school systems. It is always great to have students enjoying the outdoors and using the Arboretum as their classroom. Harvest Fest was able to host over 400 students, and an estimated 2,000 students were impacted by field trips in 2022.

Guided hikes led by volunteers engage the community with ten led hikes. Our most attended hike was the Summer Solstice night hike. Sunday Seminars returned in 2022, and we were happy to have animal rehabilitators, native plant nurseries, bee programs, and water habitats speakers.

The Kentucky State Disc Golf tournament was a success in September, with over 100 players from 12 states. We continue to see increased tourism from the Championship and Recreational courses.

2022 Birding Programs

Our birding programs include an Eastern Bluebird trail and a Purple Martin colony. A special thank you to our birding volunteers that spend many hours weekly dedicating time to environmental efforts, Susie Scholze, Dan Reasons, Chip Tate, Maria Bailey, and Nikki Rothwell.

2022 Eastern Bluebird data:

94 Eastern bluebird eggs were laid in 2022 summer; they documented that 79 hatched (84%) and 73 fledged (78%).

2022 Purple Martin data:

128 Purple Martin eggs, 121 hatched, 111 fledged (92%)24 pairs of Adult breeding pairs plus juveniles.

Benches


With the help of many donors, we placed 18 new natural stone benches within Mahr Park Arboretum in 2022.
