Kentucky Fishing: Reminder for New License!

Kentucky fishing license year begins today, March 1, and continues through the last day of February.

New licenses are required annually by the Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife. Resident and nonresident youth ages 15 and younger are not required to purchase licenses or fishing permits.

We hope you enjoy the ample recreational fishing opportunities at Mahr Park Arboretum, with seven ponds and a shoreline border of 420-acre Lake Pee Wee.


New Bee Program!


We are delighted to introduce a new educational tool for 2023, bee hives. Audubon Bee Keepers donated the bees and boxes to Mahr Park Arboretum.

The Great Backyard Bird Count 2023

The Great Backyard Bird Count was launched in 1998 by the Cornell Lab of Ornithology and the National Audubon Society, the Great Backyard Bird Count was the first online citizen-science project to collect data on wild birds and to display results in near real-time. Each February, for four days, the world comes together for the love of birds. These observations help scientists better

understand global bird populations before one of their annual migrations. (Bird Count)

Last month, the Great Backyard Bird Count hike

and classes at Mahr Park Arboretum were led by Erika Wood, Hopkins County Extention Horticulture agent, and park volunteer. Guests were engaged with presentations on "Birding 101" and "How to Attract Birds to your Garden."

Volunteer Spotlight: Chip Tate

"My first experience with the Park came in the fall of 2014 when the City of Madisonville invited me as the Executive Director of the United Way of the Coalfield to consider a Day of Caring Volunteer Project.

Since the day I spent in 2014 with Danny Peyton sharing the Mahr's Story and giving me a tour of the grounds, I fell in love with the natural beauty of the land and the tranquility it offers. That year 60 community-minded volunteers started working on the grounds, which primarily involved removing cattle fencing where Glema Mahr had been raising Black Angus cattle.

In 2015, over 150 community-minded volunteers were determined to become a part of the Mahr's Legacy and assist in preparing the Park to open the following year fulfilling the Mahr's Vision.

In the summer of 2016, while visiting the Park with the Hopkins County Happy Feet Committee, I was told that the Park was looking for volunteers, and the rest is history. That summer, my volunteer activities involved preparing the Mahr's Historic Home for the Park's official opening on October 29, 2016.

After the Park opened, my primary role was sharing the Mahr's history with visitors and leading guided hikes. Since then, my volunteer role has expanded into assisting with the Blue Bird and Purple Martin landlord programs, leading guided hikes, conducting park tours, arboretum tree tagging, and supporting the educational programs and Harvest Fest events.

As a volunteer, my greatest pleasure and reward are seeing our visitors experience the same experience I had in 2014 when I first stepped foot on this beautiful land and realized how special this gift the Mahrs left us all to enjoy.

As Lead Volunteer, I support our Park Director, Ashton Robinson, in coordinating volunteer activities and

communications.

I found something extraordinary when I experienced the natural beauty and opportunities Mahr Park Arboretum has to offer, and you can too! It may be the miles of trails to walk or hike, the Nature Play Area for your children, the Dog Park for your furry family members, disc golf, a bike or kayak, or just a bench or rocker to enjoy the views but there is something for everyone to enjoy in this special place.


