

Educational Programming

In 2019, I collaborated w/High School Teachers Maria Bailey and Kim Shaw to pilot the first Nature Fest (an outdoor event featuring environmental education stations led by high schoolers, community agencies, and Mahr Park volunteers). The following year we participated as a whole grade level, and then it launched into a county-wide event alternating between elementary schools.


